

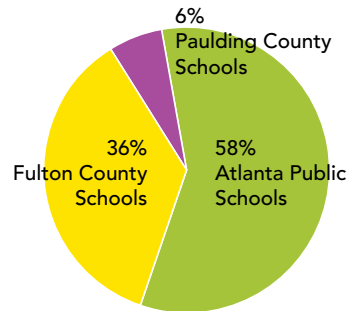


The Results

Horizons Atlanta's eight program sites served over 500 students in 2016, helping each child create a path to future success.





- Pre- and post-program assessments show that Horizons Atlanta students gained an average 2.2 months in Reading and 2.9 months in Math over the summer.
- Horizons students graduate high school at a rate 26% higher than Atlanta Public Schools students.
- 94% of Horizons high school students attend college or other postsecondary training.

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The Need

Every child in Atlanta deserves the opportunity to succeed in life and make a positive impact on their community, but not every family has the necessary resources to help their children excel. With support from our host sites, partners and community members, Horizons Atlanta is helping students in metro Atlanta reach their full potential.

Horizons Atlanta provides a six-week tuition-free summer learning program to children from low-income communities across metro Atlanta – bridging the opportunity gaps they face and changing the trajectory of their lives.

Our Approach

Horizons transforms the way students see themselves and their world. Our project-based learning model combines academics, arts, cultural enrichment and swimming instruction to combat the loss of reading and math skills known as “summer slide.” Attending over nine consecutive summers allows students to build lasting relationships with their teachers and peers while developing commitment, determination and a love of learning. Horizons transforms the way students see themselves and their world by providing experiences that build problem-solving skills, foster awareness of community responsibility, and encourage a life-long interest in learning.

- Horizons Atlanta makes a multi-year commitment to children, families and communities.
- 87% of Horizons students and families return year-to-year and we have a 94% daily attendance rate.
- Daily applications in math, reading, writing and science build confidence and reduces summer learning loss.
